### NEW BIBLE STUDY CONTINUES THIS SUNDAY

As we celebrate the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation we are focusing on the three famous hallmarks of the Reformation: GRACE and FAITH and SCRIPTURE. We recently completed a review of GRACE and turned our attention to FAITH. We are reviewing how critical FAITH is and how it shows itself in our personal lives, in our congregational life, and in our individual vocations in life. The remaining individual themes carry the following titles: 2) Nov.12 – Witness Together: Augsburg Confession; 3) Nov.19 – Join and Sing to the Lord: Congregational Worship; and 4) Nov.26 – All Serve Christ: Vocation. These classes are held in the Commons each Sunday starting at **9:15 a.m.**
