

MEDIA CENTER RELOCATION

It was determined that the cabinet, located in the balcony, that was installed many years ago primarily for the radio broadcast and volume control, does not accommodate the new technology equipment installed over the last couple of years. The **Technology Committee**, with consultation from an outside media consultant and internal organizations and individuals, presented a proposal to the congregation and received approval to construct a new desk and relocate the media center. This proposal included a design to accommodate the current technology equipment as well as future developments. It will be located on the main floor behind the last row of pews on the east side of the sanctuary. It will be constructed by David Bork, compatible with the cabinets that he already built. The design provides an open desktop workspace that has room for two media center volunteers. The plan is to have the media center constructed, installed, and functioning by the first part of August.

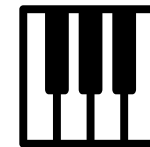
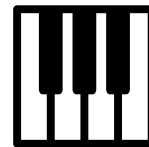
CONFIRMATION

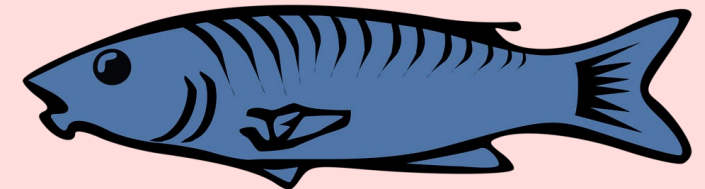
LWMS
