Parking Lot Flags

Thanks to you the parents our before school drop-off and end of day pick-up have gone very well. The flags have helped indicate where you can or can't be when it comes to bringing or picking-up your children. We plan on taking the flags down on a somewhat gradual basis. Before too long the parking lots will need to be plowed and those flags would get in the way of that operation. In a week or two we will begin the process of dismantling the flags. **FIRST** the side flags will be taken down. These are the ones that deny access to the area as a whole. **SECONDLY**, after a week or so, the flags between the light posts will be removed. **FINALLY**, after another couple of weeks, the large cones will be taken away. **WE ASK THAT YOU STILL PLACE YOUR VEHICLES IN THE SAME SPOTS YOU HAVE BEEN ALL YEAR EVEN WHEN THE FLAGS ARE NOT THERE.** Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Health Concern: There has been a confirmed case of Lice in the school. Please keep an eye out for these pesky little bugs and their nits (eggs). Lice are usually transmitted through close personal contact with other infested individuals through use of shared combs, brushes; sharing of hats, caps; via co-

mingling of these items at home of friends, at school, or other places. The impression that lice become established on persons who are unclean is not true. Bathing will not prevent or eliminate infestation once it has become established. A special over the counter shampoo and fine toothed comb are needed to treat for lice. Personal articles should be washed in hot water and/or drying using the hot cycle of the dryer. All furniture, carpeting and vehicle upholstery should be vacuumed initially, and in 7-10 days. Please encourage your child not to share clothing, hats, gloves, combs, brushes, etc.

Mr. Miller's Classes

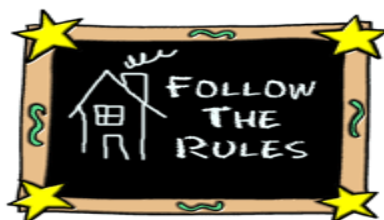
