Classroom News:

Mr. Miller's Classes

Grades 3-4 Art started their Fire Prevention posters last week. This week they will be creating 'pumpkin wagons'. They will be using markers, colored pencils, or crayons depending on what they desire to use. **Grades 5-6 Catechism** began their study of the 3rd Commandment. They learned that 'Sabbath' means rest for our souls which is received as we hear God's Word proclaimed to us. **Grade 8 Math** had their first test of the year. Topics tested included rational/irrational numbers, changing repeating decimals to fractions, adding/subtracting/multiplying/dividing scientific numbers, and comparing numbers written in scientific notation.

4K News: This week in 4K was a bit different. We spent Tuesday morning with our grandparents, then had reading buddies, and then had our first fire drill. On Thursday we walked to the fire station and got to learn about fire safety and see the fire trucks up close. Our Bible stories this week were Joseph becomes Ruler in Egypt and Joseph Forgives His Brothers.
