#### "His Children Our Mission" Update

On January 3 at 7:00 a special meeting of the congregation will be held to determine if and when we break ground for the Early Learning Center and the 3 new classrooms. This will be the end of three years of exploring, assessing and planning. At this meeting, the congregation will be presented a plan to expand our Christian Education Ministry at St. Peter with an Early Learning Center and the new classrooms to accommodate our ever growing school population.

The project cost has remained approximately the same throughout this process. The bids that we received last week were in line with estimates. Many members of St. Peter's have been very generous with their donations and promises and other funding sources have been identified. The goal has been to construct the ELC and the shell of the 3 classrooms with the potential of completing the classrooms when resources are available. The funding is almost there!

One of the goals that was set was to have member loans in the amount of \$300,000 that could be used or a 5 year period. This concept was used very successfully for the Building on the Rock project and made a big difference in financing the project. At this time, we have received commitments of \$100,000 in member loans. We ask again that you consider sharing your blessings with our "His Children Our Mission" project for the 5 years and then receive the resource back at the end of that time. Recognizing that interest rates have increased; the member loans will be offered from 0% - 4% depending on the wishes of the contributor. If you are interested, or have questions, please contact Jason Radtke or the church office. As it would be important to know of your intentions prior to the January 3 meeting, please make a commitment prior to December 31.

Thank you for your continued prayers for this project and please attend the January 3 meeting to hear the details of the plan.
