Students in grades 5-8 will head to Oakwood Cemetery in Weyauwega next Friday, September 29, to learn more about some of the people buried there as well as Weyauwega history. Former St. Peter Pastor Peter Lange will be one who is featured at this event. He was influential in the building of the second church (1888) and the first school building (1900). On Saturday, September 30, this same event will be open to the public for a fee of \$5 per person.

**7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade News:** All students have finished up iREADY testing for both reading and math. These results will be used to set goals and allow me to plan for student needs moving forward. Seventh graders are continuing their work with integers and rational numbers in math. We will start to multiply and divide with rational numbers and integers. In writing, students are using the RACES strategy to

write a constructed response to their reading. We have started reading *Banner in the Sky* in reading and students are analyzing characters in the novel. Please note, grades will be checked on Sunday evening for sports eligibility. Students are expected to check Gradelink each morning to know where they are at with grades and missing assignments. Next week Friday, 5th through 8th graders will be attending a Cemetery Walk facilitated by community and church members. Students will gain understanding and appreciation for cemeteries as a source of history.
