Fun Ideas for Science with the Recycling

- 1. Build Your own DIY solar oven: How long it takes to cook different foods (melting s'mores, cook pizza, frying an egg)?
- 2. Plastic Bottle Greenhouse: Make your very own mini greenhouse using different size plastic bottles. Which bottle grows the biggest plants?
- 3. Composting using different recyclable materials like milk Cartoon, plastic bottles, paper cups? Which container is the best environment for composting?
- 4. Make a homemade balance from recyclable materials: Compare the mass of different objects.
- 5. Paper plate marble maze: Which design gets the marble through the fastest? Fun and incorporating the concepts of push, pull, force and gravity.
